

## The Rehabilitation of the Lower Jordan River (Phase A) and the Development of the Border Region Between the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and the State of Israel along the Jordan River

## October 20-21, 2014

Israel's Lower Jordan Rehabilitation Administration is planning an international conference that will present the master plan for the rehabilitation and development of the Jordan River, promoting river restoration and development of the area for the benefit of nature and society. The conference will be devoted to joint-discussions regarding the optimal ways to restore streams and rivers by learning the lessons of the Jordan River Rehabilitation Project.

The Jordan River is sacred to the ancient monotheistic religions. It is a major water source for the people living on its banks and is the basis for a unique aquatic ecosystem in the region.

However, for many years, the Jordan River has suffered from pollution and a lack of fresh water. Only marginal flows have been measured recently in comparison to the historic flow, and sewage has contaminated large sections of the river.

The Jordan's waters have always been needed to quench the thirst of growing populations and to irrigate their crops. Decades of conflict between the riparian neighbors made the river a barrier and while the Peace Agreement between Jordan and Israel led to the building of some bridges, the Lower Jordan River is still largely inaccessible to the public along most of its banks.

The challenges are immense but IT IS TIME TO MAKE THE CHANGE. We must revive the river and create a center for peace and tranquility.

In the spirit of the Peace Treaty between the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and the State of Israel, the Government of Israel offered an initial budget and fresh water for the rehabilitation and development project, and the Jordanian Government decided on a parallel project on its side.

### What do we wish to achieve?

- The ecological restoration of the river and its surroundings.
- In Stage I, the development of a master plan and its implementation for sustainable development of the Jordan Valley along the international border between Israel and Jordan. How will we do it?

A. Improve the quality of water in the river:

- Sewage will be treated (the Bitaniya Treatment Facility is almost in the operative stage) and allocated for irrigation.
- Brackish springs will be desalinated and allocated for irrigation.
- Fresh Water The existing amounts of sewage and brackish water flowing to the river will be gradually replaced with fresh water from the Sea of Galilee.
- B. Design a regional development master plan that is relevant for both banks:
- An all-inclusive solution to protect natural resources and ecological corridors
- Mapping and developing catalysts for economic growth for all residents in the region including:
- National heritage sites Archeological and antiquities sites
- A landscaping development program that will focus on botany, zoology, water springs, flora and fauna
- Promoting the Valley as a rural tourist spot and developing tourist infrastructure What can we expect in the future?
- We look forward to completing the infrastructure needed on both sides of the river.
- The master plans in Jordan and Israel will be completed.
- The master plans will be implemented.
